



ROCKBURN'S SCHOOL-WIDE ENRICHMENT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Welcome back to a new school year. This overview will introduce you to the Gifted and Talented Program. It contains information about Curriculum-Based Enrichment Units and Instructional Seminars in grades two through five.

CURRICULUM-BASED ENRICHMENT UNITS

Enrichment Units are implemented throughout the year in second through fifth grade. Students meet with the GT teacher for 45-minute periods each time. There are one to two classes per week. These units are tied directly to the curriculum from some of the following disciplines: language arts, social studies, science, health, math, and technology.

Students are identified for participation at the beginning of each unit by a committee including the classroom teacher, other team members, and the enrichment team. A selection grid which was developed from countywide criteria for each unit is used to help in this process. For example, the criteria for the second grade transportation unit includes the student's reading level, writing level, social studies performance, task commitment, motivation and a talent spotting lesson. Some math enrichment is ongoing throughout the year with the above grade level math students in grade three. GT math is for students who have been identified for participation in grades four and five and meet daily.

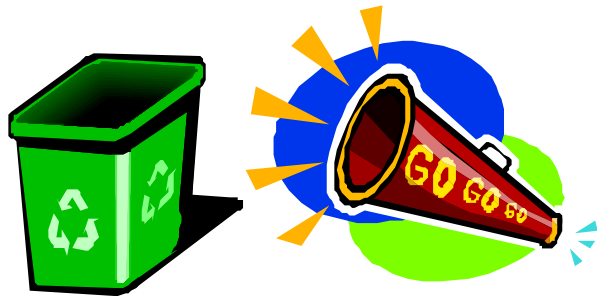

INSTRUCTIONAL SEMINARS

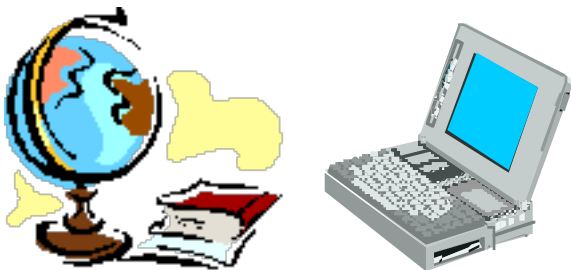

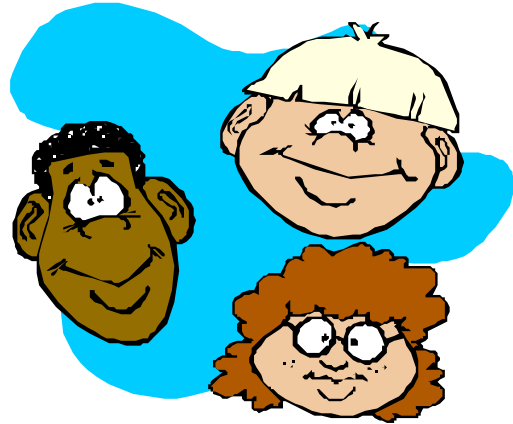
SCHOOLWIDE ENRICHMENT FAIR

GT STUDENT ORIENTATION - ALL STUDENTS IN GRADES TWO THROUGH FIVE
